



Region Maps LTAP



Sign-up for the pre-conference day, Professional Development Bicycle Ride, is now available. (You need to be registered for the conference before you may sign-up for this session.)

The ride travels at an easy pace, set by the slowest rider. Each group is followed by a "sweep" who makes sure no one is left behind. Professional Development Bicycle Rides are designed to be accessible to anyone with basic bike handling skills (Basic bike handling skills are defined as being able to ride in a straight line for one mile without falling). At the end of the experience participants will be able to imagine how to organize similar events in their home communities.

Professional Development Bicycle Rides have been incredibly effective at creating an experience of common understanding. Expertise is shared across disciplines and priorities emerge. Transportation professionals, leaders, and community influencers move more efficiently towards implementing policies, practices, programs, and infrastructure to create peaceful streets for all road users. TRACK B: BASICS OF PROWAG FOR LOCAL GOV (TRAIN THE TRAINER) GOVERNOR'S BALLROOM

This training will include a field visit. Some vests and hard hats will be available, but we encourage you to bring your own if possible.

Facilities in the public right-of-way (including walkways, ramps, curb ramps and landings, crosswalks, and pedestrian overpasses/underpasses) must be designed, constructed and maintained to serve all users. To meet the users' requirements, those involved with designing, building and maintaining infrastructure in the public right-of-way need a clear understanding of the wide range of disabilities that occur and the challenges faced by persons with disabilities. This workshop will identify relevant criteria pertaining to accessibility in the public right-of-way. Requirements for ensuring accessibility in existing facilities versus work in new construction and alterations will be discussed. Design elements necessary for achieving accessibility will be reviewed. Best practices will be identified. The "field activities" portion of the class will be held on the sidewalks and streets in the vicinity of the conference hotel and will include activities involving manual wheelchairs, long canes and low-vision googles to allow participants to simulate the challenges faced by disabled persons in moving about in the built-environment.

Collecting & Storing Asset Management Data:

Collecting Asset Management (AM) data is a big first step when managing your communities' assets. Agencies are discovering that more data equates to more information and better solutions. The next big issue is what to do with all of that data. Local agencies may be new to data management and lack the resources to manage data in-house and in the cloud. Several LTAP centers store data for statewide AM programs, and the volume of data and the cost of securing data is more than expected. Threats from ransomware and cybersecurity significantly add to this cost and staff effort. Indiana LTAP has been traveling down this road for several years and is willing to share some of the threats and solutions they have found.

Drone Sessions: Unmanned Aerial Vehicles for Transportation Uses:

Unmanned Aerial Vehicles are becoming more popular for transportation related uses. That's a Match! Growing Your Center Through an Understanding of Federal Match Requirements:

Most federal funds come with a state or local match requirement, sometimes up to 50% of the federal amount. This can present a barrier to access federal funds when local financial resources are in short supply. Active Listening to Expand Center Programs

In fact, the results from more than 40 years of research suggest that 90% of top performers are individuals who show high levels of emotional intelligence. This presentation reviews the trends and events that have tended to influence each generation, and provides insights into the different work habits, values and motivational factors that may be encountered.
